Update on the Vacancy Situation

You may recall that in August's Newsletter I hinted that September would be busy. Unfortunately this has proved not to be the case. There has been a little slippage at diocese level, and diaries could not be coordinated in time.

However, the next stage, a Section 12 meeting, will take place on 30th September. This gathering includes our two parish representatives - Viv Buckley and Ed Brindley, Rev Peter Townley (the Archdeacon, acting on behalf of the Bishop) and our Patron, Rev Michael Duff, acting on behalf of the Church Pastoral Aid Society. (CPAS) This meeting approves the Parish Profile/Brochure, agrees the job advert and opens the door to recruitment of a new vicar.

The draft advert goes to CPAS on 15th October and, if approved, it will go to the Church Times on 22nd October. It will appear in the Church Times on 5th, 12th, 19th of November. The closing date for applications will be 25th November and the interviews will be on 19th January 2022.

So the new vicar, hopefully, will arrive anytime between Easter and September. It is longer than we had thought or hoped. We need to pray for the process, for the successful spirit-led recruitment and our new vicar who will lead us in the new direction which God will show us. Pray for our leadership. Keep us working together in harmony, give us the strength to continue and pray that we will be guided by the Spirit. Please talk to any of the church wardens if you have questions about this process.

the celebration of Harvest in early October.


The choir extend an invitation to you to join with them in singing selected hymns set to well-known
