A Prayer for Ukraine


God of peace and justice,

One of my earliest memories of Peter dates back many years to when, as a Reader, he was preparing to deliver a sermon. He was with Rupert in the Emmaus Rooms and were deep in prayer before moving into the Church. I was passing nearby and simply by glancing at Peter I could see the intensity of his desire to serve his Lord and give of his best which, of course, he did. As I grew to know Peter and Margaret I quickly realised what devoted and utterly committed Christians they both were. Margaret would often ask me to join her in prayer for whoever was concerning her at the time. When I myself was shortly to undergo surgery Peter visited me at home to pray with and for me, which was a source of great comfort. I retain to this day the vivid picture of Margaret's radiant smiling face as I held out the chalice to her during communion. Both she and Peter shared their love for the Lord; they were suffused with faith and held an intense love of Jesus which so powerfully communicated itself to all with whom they came into contact.

Frequently, when collecting my godsons from Sandal Endowed (as it was then called) at the end of the school day, I would take them on a brief visit to Peter and Margaret's home on nearby Chevet Lane. The boys were always made most welcome and Peter and Margaret coped wonderfully well with their two boisterous visitors. Indeed it was a remarkable feature of both Peter and Margaret that even guite late in life they led a Saturday evening youth group with which Julian and I and a number of others were pleased to help. Latterly I will not have been alone in missing the company, friendship and inspiration of Peter and Margaret. Following Margaret's sad death Peter left the area to receive day-to-day care from his family in Bedford. He has been wonderfully cared for particularly by his daughter Sassy, with whom he spent his last months. Notwithstanding the physical distance between us I have been able to keep in fairly regular contact with Peter through brief but wonderful telephone conversations. I was able to give him news of all the "goings on" at St Helen's and St Paul's and of all his old friends and acquaintances gained from having spent so many happy years amongst us and ministering to us. It was a blessing that he was able to spend his last days being comforted and cared for by his immediate family with great love and devotion before passing away peacefully.

If you have ever seen early photographs of Peter and Margaret you will, I am sure, have been struck by the vision of such a handsome couple who could have been Hollywood film stars. Tall and elegant, they made an incredibly glamorous couple! They met, fell in love and married very quickly - and what a partnership they became! I feel a huge sense of privilege to have known them and to have been their friend. I have no doubt that they have been true disciples of Jesus, drawing others to the Lord by their vibrant and lived faith.

Covid Update

The Prime Minister's announcement regarding covid was rather eclipsed by the distressing events in the Ukraine. However, essentially covid restrictions have largely been removed. It will affect our gatherings in church by removing the need for the QR code and the taking of names of those attending services.

Our approach to mask wearing will remain the same for the time being. Mask wearing is not mandatory but is recommended for the comfort of others, although you can attend services without masks. Singing without masks does pose a higher risk of spreading the virus and this should be borne in mind by those not wearing them.

Covid is still around and although numbers are declining we still need to maintain awareness . Conversations I have had recently demonstrate that feelings continue to be strongly held regarding the necessity for masks, whilst conversely other feel equally strongly that they are not needed. We need to be sensitive to the feelings of other. There will be more updates as the situation develops.
