Ringing incorporated 70 of the classic 'call change' named 'Queens'. ( i.e. bells rung in the order 1-3-5-2-4-6 ) and a plain course of the method 'Plain Bob Minor'.





We have arranged a team to ring a special full Peal of over 5,000 changes here at St Helen's with Jack Endersby, on Saturday 25th of June, dedicated to Her Majesty the Queen for her Platinum Jubilee. Jack learned to ring here, and has also rung regularly here for 10 years . Recently he achieved his first Peal at a neighbouring Church. This will be his first Peal at his own Church , and the first full Peal here for many years!

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#### New Gift Aid Lead Person

I am the new lead for St Helen's and St Paul's on Gift Aid. Gift Aid is a way for the church to get tax back from HMRC where taxpayers make donations. We recently received the sum of £22,530 from HMRC so it is a vital source of funds to keep the churches running. If a person donates £10 then with Gift Aid I can get a further £2.50 from HMRC.

If you are a taxpayer, there are three ways for you to give to the church so that I can recover Gift Aid.

1 you fill in a Gift Aid Form obtainable from the parish office or at the back of church where you say what you are able to donate (one off, weekly, monthly or quarterly or whatever), your address and sign it. You then set up a standing order to make the donations regularly. The form enables me to recover Gift Aid on each donation.

2 you fill in the Gift Aid form as above but tick the section requesting weekly envelopes (currently brown in colour) then whenever you attend church you put your donations in the envelope for the collection plate. The form enables me to recover Gift Aid on each donation.

3 there are also Green Envelopes at the back of church which you can write in your name, address and date and put in the collection plate. I can recover Gift Aid on these one off donations.
