Hello everyone!

Thanks so much for the amazing welcome I received on Wednesday 31st August at my Installation and Induction service. It was great to worship with so many of you and I am looking forward to meeting everyone properly in the coming weeks and months.

As I have been praying and preparing to become Vicar at Sandal Magna, I have come with three priorities for the first few months:

- Reset
- Relationships
- Rebuild



1. Reset – when any new Vicar arrives in a parish, it is a time to celebrate and be thankful for the past journey of the churches, but also a time to start a new



adventure. Before we talk about what we want to be doing as a parish in the coming years, I want to take some time to talk about how we want to be together as a church community. Each church has values they live as a community and it will be good to take some time to re-visit these values to make sure we are happy with them and that we are putting them into practice. Some of my values are: being Jesus-centred, generosity, simplicity, always learning, listening to God and each other – there are many more. I wonder if you can take time to think about your values – and the values we'd like to embody in our parish? PTO.....

Thank You


