
My hope is, that however you find yourself this Christmas, you will know Jesus close to you as you celebrate. Every blessing,

Two New Ways to Give to our churches

As well as the collection plate, regular giving envelopes, green envelopes and standing order donations to the bank we now have two new ways to give to the work of our parish: Firstly the new Payaz digital giving machine in St Helen's by the door which can receive card payments. (see photo) We hope that occasional visitors to services without cash may use this.



Secondly we have a Give A Little website which can be reached using this QR Code using which card payments of any size with or without gift aid can be made.

We are seeking new ways to give as the church budget for next year has a significant shortfall due to energy costs and repairs as well as general inflation and we hope that the new methods may attract some extra donations as the church is wholly funded by its local community. Acts 435 helps people in our parish - can you help them?



Acts 435 is a way to directly help someone in need with something specific like a cooker, clothing or bills. We partner with Acts 435 and have helped lots of people in our community with essential needs. Can you reach out this Christmas to help someone?



Acts 435 is an online giving charity, directly connecting those who want to give with those who are in genuine need of their help, through a network of local churches and charities. It is a Christian Charity and its name comes from Acts Ch4 v35 where the early Christians gave for those in need. We are a partner with Acts 435 and you can support them by making a donation specifically for the needs of one of the people on their website. 100% of the donation amount goes to the recipient and you receive a thank you update when the need has been met. This is how it works:

- A local church or charity becomes an Acts 435 partner
- Partners post urgent needs on behalf of people in their community
- Donors read stories of need and give through the Acts 435 platform
- Partner contacts person in need and gives the item so desperately needed
