The Bells at St Helen's

We have much needed new ropes after 15 years, this time we chose green and gold 'sallys', though we don't plan to repaint our ringing chamber to match! Jack, Shaun and Eddie achieved challenging new skills, spending a VERY long Tuesday evening, removing the old ropes and installing the new, by attaching them to the tail end of the old and hauling them up from the top. Sounds easy but it isn't!!





The ropes for bells 1,2 and 3 are 50 foot long, and those for 4,5 and 6 are 53 foot long (yes we do still order in 'old, measurements!) They reach from the folded double tail end, which we hold, in the ringing chamber, through wooden channels in the clock chamber and into the bell chamber, where they go round the bell wheel and fasten in a very secure and traditional way to the wheel cross braces . (see photo of the bell chamber).

Great care is needed to have the Sally's at the correct height, and given that the ringers vary in height by more than a foot this isn't easy, though we do have a selection of boxes to stand on, 2 nicknamed the bread board and the book shelf! We now all face the challenge of getting

used to the differences of the new ropes and their bounce as they stretch a little until they settle in. The bells, wheels and frame are due for their regular maintenance check now, which will be done by Roger, one of our ringers and Tower Keeper, who will lead a master class for Jack and Shaun to pass on the skills needed.
