I am so pleased to tell you about the Every Good Work project. This is a youth project in Wakefield where three parishes are working together – ours, St. Catherine's Belle Vue and St. George's Lupset. We have received funding from the Church Commissioners for this project which aims to engage young people in our areas in exploring faith through action – encouraging and equipping young people



to serve in areas of need and social justice and also encouraging them to reflect on faith. We have been given £1 million over the next 3-5 years for this project and we will be aiming to employ three youth workers, one placed in each church and a project co-ordinator. Revd David Gerrard from St. Catherine's is heading up the project and has done a brilliant job so far. I am also pleased to announce we



appointed 2 of the 3 youth-workers for the project in interviews in the last couple of weeks. You are likely to know our very own Phil Asquith who has been appointed to the youth worker role based in St. Helen's and you also may have met Joshua Monks who recently had his banns read at St. Helen's, who has been appointed to the youth worker role at St. Catherine's. Both appointments are still subject to DBS checks and references etc, but we hope they will both be able to take up their appointments to start the project rolling in the next few months.

Please pray for them as they start this new adventure and pray for myself and the other clergy

across the churches as we seek to appoint the third youth worker role and the project co-ordinator in November.

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A Parcel from Amazon!

I've been waiting over six months for the delivery of a parcel from Amazon. Well, not really a parcel - a book and not any book, but a hymn book.

You will not be surprised to know that I have shelves of hymn books but this is a new version titled 'The Revised English Hymnal'. Work started by the compilers in 2012 and they have been on the brink of publication since early this year.

Why do I need a copy of this hymn book when 'Ancient and Modern (Hymns and Songs for Refreshing Worship)', first published in 2013, continues to serve the Traditional Services held at St. Helen's - and I am sure will do so for many years to come.

We could ask why the church purchased copies of the 2013 edition when the 1987 'A & M New Standard' version was still being used and in good condition. The simple answer is because of the vast number of hymns by new composers and authors in the hymn book we use today. Just think how much we enjoy singing:

- 678 In Christ alone my hope is found Stuart Townend (b.1963) & Keith Getty (b.1974)
- · 747 O God, you search me and you know me
- 42 Longing for light, we wait in darkness (Christ, be our light!)

- 489 From heaven you came, helpless babe (The Servant King)
- 719 Lord, the light of your love is shining (Shine, Jesus, shine)

I enjoy selecting hymns which reflect the seasons of the church year and the readings of the day. This process reminds me of diners going out to a restaurant for a meal. They look at the menu and either find something they know they like and have had many times before or they choose something new because it's there to be tried.

Selecting hymns is similar - we can take the easy way out and choose the hymns we know or take the harder path and try something different which can prove most rewarding. The 'Revised English Hymnal' contains 185 hymns new to the users of their previous edition. New words, new tunes and new ideas for the choir and congregation to enhance the music which is a vital component of every service.

Footnote:

The English Hymnal was first published in 1906 as a companion to the 'Book of Common Prayer' to assist congregations to take a full part in worship.

In 1962, the Oxford University Press produced the English Hymnal Service Book which included 335 hymns, canticles and the 150 psalms (interestingly this was adopted by the then Sandal Endowed CE Junior School who used this for over ten years!).

The 'new' English Hymnal was published in 1986 celebrating the 80th Anniversary of the first publication.

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Deanery Synod Meeting at Wakefield Cathedral 27th June 2023.

45 people attended, including Revd Hannah Smith, Andrea North and Mike Keeton from Sandal Magna. Chair: Revd David Gerrard - Area Dean. Speaker: Revd Dr Phillip Hobday - Canon Missioner at the Cathedral. 'What is the Cathedral and what can it do to help parishes'

Phillip said that mission, in parishes and in cathedrals, is particularly difficult at the moment. Twenty years ago the media was more limited e.g. most people viewed the same TV programmes so there were common 'talking points' in society. Twenty years ago Christianity was the accepted religious norm in this society - now it is not so. People now view media 'on demand' but the church expects people to come to a set place at a set time. Therefore people who are used to 'viewing' at their own convenience find this difficult. The meeting was invited to discuss this in groups.

There was a further discussion on the role of the Cathedral . It was concluded that: The Cathedral is a visible presence of the Church in the City. It is the place for Civic services, Ordinations, National and Local commemorations, the Church of England's legal tradition of Morning and Evening Prayer which anyone can attend and its choral tradition of worship. It welcomes visitors and school groups which can be guided by Cathedral staff. Phillip then invited the meeting to a short tour of the cathedral. During the meeting David Gerrard conducted the ordinary business of the synod i.e. approval of the previous Meetings Minutes; the election to the various 'Standing Committees' etc.etc. He announced that the 'Follow Me' sessions at the Cathedral would begin on the 12th October with Bishop Arora-Bishop of Kirkstall; 9th November Revd Canon David Gerrard himself; 25th January 2024 the Archbishop of York,Very Revd Stephen Cottrell.

The next Deanery Synod Meeting will be at St Helen's, Sandal Magna, on the 8th November when the speaker will be Mr Nick Drayton from 'Christians Against Poverty' 7pm for 7.30pm. This will be an open meeting -please invite members of your congregations to attend.


Occasional "Cone Volunteers" needed at St Helen's

Rt Revd Dr John Thompson, Bishop of Selby welcomed Peter to this new Ministry saying he will bring experience and wisdom to these parishes in the Selby Deanery. Peter has been Archdeacon of Pontefract for 15 years and was also Chair of the Mothers Union in the Diocese and Chair of the Leeds Diocesan Advisory Committee. Peter has worked in Council Estates in Bolton and also as Vicar of St Mary-Le-Tower a Civic Church in the centre of Ipswich, Suffolk. 

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News from our link parish, Bunda, Tanzania

Receive much greetings, thanks and blessings from St Peters, Bunda. Thank you for fundraising for our church. We have received the money you sent us twice.

The church has bought 77 iron sheets of 3 meters and has paid 1.5million Tanzanian shillings to buy 20 pieces of black pipe for roofing the new church building. We now have 384 of the 400 iron sheets needed and 30 of the 210 pieces of black pipe for



the roofing. We still need more money to finish the roofing process.

The church has more people and needs to enlarge the building. It is expected to hold 600 worshippers if finished.

May the warmth of the love of God move within us all and the Spirit be found in the ripples of grace of the living God around us.
