4 Report on the Proceedings of the PCC and the Annual Review for 2023

The report of the proceedings of the PCC is included in the Annual Review. There were no questions on this.

5 To receive reports on the Financial Affairs of the Parish including:

- Independently examined accounts of the Parochial Church Council.
- Independently examined statements of the funds and properties of the Parochial Church Council.
- Budget for 2024 has been accepted by the PCC
- Gift Aid
- Appointment of Auditors

Andrea North, the treasurer, provided copies of the financial reports prior to the meeting and carefully commented on the meaning of the various sections of the report, she highlighted key points and explained discrepancies with predicted spending.

Income - There was a big increase in planned giving in 2023 almost in line with pre covid. One off donations were also increased. We are always grateful for legacies they contribute significantly to our church.

It was clear that giving had increased.

Expenditure - Again Andrea took the meeting through key points clarifying that it does not include the Spring.

Andrea stressed that we constantly aim to keep costs down eg smart meters have been installed. We were able to pay for all repairs during the year – there were a couple of major expenditures eg £1,800 for concrete at the back of the church for the shed. Rewiring was also

a big item, otherwise repairs were relatively minor. Andrea responded to a query by explaining a line on depreciation of items and the need to be saving to replace these. Some expenditure carried out in previous years were paid for in this year.

We were able to fully pay the Parish Share of £80,000 for 2023 and maintained charity giving to Cross project, CMS (Catherine Lee in Taiwan) and Mara Project. Despite setting a negative budget for 2023 we actually spent £7,000 less than our income.

Andrea was very adept at answering questions and queries emphasizing that she would be happy to take questions after the meeting too. Her full notes are available to anyone who would like to consider them in more detail. We try to keep 3 months running costs as recommended by the Charity Commission (£28,000) .

The large legacy was unrestricted and so we are approaching how to spend this prayerfully. Brief comment was made on the Budget for 2024, again answering any queries and questions. Estimated total income for 2024 is set at.....£164,500

(NB Expenditure wages increased due to 5% pay rise. Maintenance cost have risen Parish share has risen to £84,500 -we are aiming to pay it! - Hannah explained this is our contribution to the Diocese and that it covers the cost of a Vicar, support by Diocesean Officers in Safeguarding, Legal advice etc and also it is an investment in parishes that may be less well-funded than ours in poorer areas.)

£16,444 is the predicted shortfall and may need to draw on reserves.

The financial reports had been ratified by the PCC prior to this meeting.

Opportunity was given for queries to be raised: all were answered

Hannah pointed out the need to celebrate that we set a negative budget last year and yet we ended the year on a positive budget.

Nigel spoke about Gift Aid -thanking all for giving generously. There was a 10% increase in giving which was also reflected in gift aid - there was even an HMRC payment for interest on payment lost!!! Payaz machine brought in £1200+ in 2023

9 Parish Life

<u>The Spring</u> - Jackie on behalf of The Spring shared a few insights - calling it an amazing place. Huge improvements to the kitchen and washing up area were very welcome. There had a number of charitable events in 2023 eg Coffee morning for Breast Cancer. Activities are held in the building eg Marshall Arts Club. There are 80 volunteers. Thankyou to you all for supporting the Spring in so many different ways. There was huge thanks from everyone for being there and providing amazing food.

<u>CAP</u> - A few words on CAP's work within the Parish from Nick and Vivienne Drayton who manage the CAP Debt Centre, explaining that CAP's aim is to end poverty.

Nick and Vivienne explained common reasons for debt and CAP's crucial role in helping people with unexpected life happenings that lead to debt. Crucially opportunities are always taken to share the gospel. Vivienne also mentioned the CAP Money Course which Cath had run at the Spring with support from Vivienne. They hope to repeat this soon.

Thankyou to Nick and Vivienne for this amazing work.

<u>Youth Project - Every Good Work</u> Phil explained his role working with two other churches and two other Youth leaders in Wakefield. A youth group has begun in Portobello thanks to regular volunteers. The Gospel has been talked about to over 1,000 secondary children since January. The youth leaders are working with The Cross Project in schools. They are aiming to start an Acorn Course - exploring faith by looking at how Christians serve others and why they do this.

<u>Schools</u> - Julian shared about links with our local Church School - Sandal Castle and gave a small insight into how the Church contributes.

There are over 600 children speaking 20 different languages in the school. There are 5 governors from our fellowship who contribute willingly of their time. Hannah takes regular assemblies. PCC agreed to fund POP UK which was an amazing opportunity to have local

families in Church. We are involved in interviews, celebrations of Christmas, Easter. Whatever we can do to share the love of Jesus in the school.

All children going up to High school are to receive a 'It's Your Move' book by Scripture Union and Phil will lead sessions on transition up to senior school. 8 other schools have now responded to also have the books for their children including Walton Primary where Phil will also go in and lead a session.

<u>Children's work</u> - Sadly Laura couldn't be with us at the last minute, but Hannah shared that things are going well with her area of responsibility. We have increasing numbers of children registered to be part of Sunday School and more volunteers. The Toddler Group on Wednesdays at PCF is going well and also Make Lunch - which runs on Wednesdays during school holidays to provide a meal and activities for families that may struggle for food during these times. We run Make Lunch with TLG a Christian Charity and now work with regular families.

<u>Portobello</u> - Sarah works in Portobello with families and the work is going from strength to strength. Sarah is a bundle of energy and good at applying for bids such as 'our year for Wakefield' - people come into the centre and grow in confidence, friendships are made and some wonderful activities are done.

<u>Hope</u>- If we know Jesus is alive we can always have hope. We live in a world where there is often little hope and we need to communicate and live out hope.

<u>Hands</u> - we don't bless with words we bless with actions. We were challenged to open our hands to what God wants US TO DO.

This is a year of Team - Phil has joined and Lizzy our curate will be arriving soon. Hannah also shared our aim to employ a Children's Team Leader - someone who will take some of the role with Children and Families that Sally did previously. This is part of why we have a small deficit predicted for 2024 - to employ someone in this role. Hoping to do this in the next few months. Please pray for the right team and the cohesion of that team. Each of us has a role in that team. What does God want you to lay down and take up? Hannah thanked all of you for all that we do.

Hannah took a special moment to recognise those who we have lost during the year and are thankful for them and grateful for all that they did in the Parish.

We had a moment of stillness to recall something that God has said to us and to pray about it. Hannah Closed in prayer and then we all said the grace together.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. Amen.
