Hello everyone,

It was great to see so many of you over the Easter period – during Holy Week and on Easter day itself as we journeyed again alongside Jesus through his death and resurrection – being reminded both of his amazing sacrifice for us and of the hope and life he brings.

Over that period our sound system in church had its own mini death and resurrection event as one of our amplifiers blew altogether on Palm Sunday. Good Friday found Phil and Dave, a local sound engineer taking apart the whole sound system and putting it together again so that we could hear the services in St. Helen's on Easter Sunday — our thanks go out to them for all their hard work.



We knew for a while that the amplifiers were on their last legs and had been planning to do some serious work on the sound system, but increased costs due to rising energy prices had delayed our hands. However this event has prompted us to act now as the system is being held together with string (not literally!).

We need to spend about £5k on new speakers and amplifiers for the front of church as a matter of urgency and could do with spending another £5-10k in the next couple of years to make the rest of the AV (audio-visual) system good for the next 10-15 years.

DEFIBRILLATOR COFFEE MORNING

The Church Serving the Community
Defib Challenge – Launched in June 2022
Signed, Sealed and Delivered September 2022



It is now three years since the hard work and generosity of many members of the parish, the community, families and friends resulted in over £2100 being raised for the purchase of a 'NEW' defibrillator which is now fixed to the outside wall of The Spring and the 'old' machine from The Spring updated and installed in the Emmaus Room at St. Helen's.

To maintain both machines in full working order, it is necessary to purchase new batteries (approx. £250) and pads (approx. £150) at regular intervals.

Unfortunately, the small amount of money left in the Church Defib Account from our previous event has now nearly come to an end. So....

We think now is the right time to hold another Fundraiser to allow us to cover the cost of batteries/pads which will be required over the next year or two! A Defib Demonstration (given by Perry Morton – our Defib Guardian) along with a Coffee Morning (run by the Women's Fellowship and including a cake stall) will be held on Saturday 28th June 2025 in The Emmaus Room at St. Helen's. Coffee will be served from 10.00am to 12 noon with the demonstration starting at 11.00am.

Please come along and support our Fundraiser, learn how to use (but hopefully not require) the Defib, have a coffee, buy some cake from our stall and chat with friends!

Collection buckets will be in The Spring from the beginning of June and the church from the middle of June, so can we please ask, once again, that you support our Fundraiser and give generously to help us maintain our two Defib machines for another few years. We are most grateful to all of you!


